

Gane Compton's Carleteria was a 24-hour diner San Francisco. It served as a community spot for trans women and strag queens who were often being arrested for breaking gender stereotypes, such as wearing lipstick or maccars, or even wearing a blouse that buttoned on the "wrong" side. In 1966, the trans activists stood up to police at the Compton Cafeteria and fought against police brutality and LGBTO discrimination. This helped to set the groundwork for other LGBTO activism in America.
