
Look for Cs. They are all around you. There are big Cs on every $Crayola^{\otimes}$ product. While in a car ask children to watch for road signs and ads that contain C. Before kids can write Cs, it helps to trace the C shape, practicing where to start and stop this partial circle.



Say C to hear its many different sounds. Experiment with using familiar words. The C in castle, Crayola®, and chord sound like "kuh." The C in princess makes a hissing sound. Sometimes C sounds like its name, as in cedar, but then entirely differently in chest.
