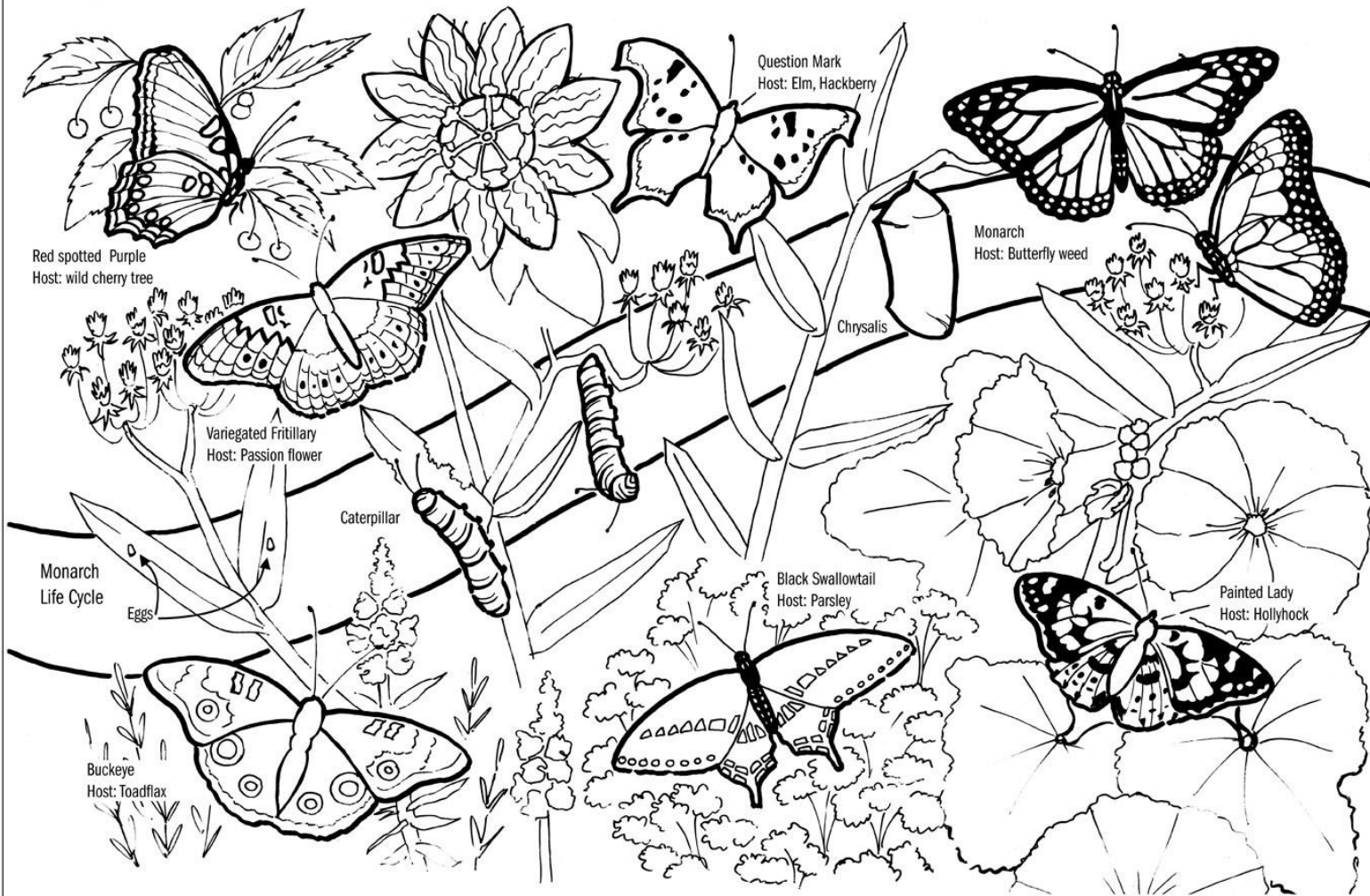

BGO Butterfly Festival
September 2 through October 31, 2008

Plan to visit the Garden during peak butterfly season! Guided butterfly walks by appointment and each Sunday at 1pm starting September 14. Observe caterpillars, chrysalises, and newly emerged butterflies in a special display case. The best time to observe butterflies is the early afternoon, but there is butterfly activity throughout the Garden on sunny days. Butterfly festival activities are free with paid Garden admission.
